TIPS FOR TEACHING PARENTS

Hopefully this lesson will cause our children to ask questions about baptism, and we will surely want to be prepared to answer those questions.

One of the hardest, of course, is the query of the very young child about when a person is old enough to be baptized. Our teaching in a lesson like this will do a lot to make sure our children are ready for baptism when the time comes for them.

If your children have witnessed a recent baptism where you worship, you have a built-in link between the story and their actual experience. Let's use this sort of thing to bring the story out of the distant past and into our families' present life.
