TIPS FOR TEACHING PARENTS

Two lessons are obvious in this story. Perhaps the most powerful to our children will be the idea that Christ sees everything they do. This type of miracle is particularly fascinating to the very young child who is still awed and puzzled by space and time concepts, but even those of us who are old enough to fully understand that a person can't be two places at the same time are touched by the idea that God can.

The other lesson is one that all our children need to learn while they are very young: Each of the men in this story brought a friend to Jesus. Christianity will never stop growing if our children learn this lesson from our behavior before them.
