## TIPS FOR TEACHING PARENTS

We can lose our children in the deep water of this story unless we are careful. Most of the truths here are beyond the understanding of many adults, not to mention our little children. We suggest that parents follow the guidance of this lesson sheet and deal with just one main thought—preferably Jesus' insistence, "You must be born again."

Even this thought is hard to explain to a small child. We might explain it as a chance to start over when we make mistakes, possibly illustrating with some mistake the child has made recently and would like to correct. Or—to a child who understands the processes of birth, we might explain that this is the way we become children of God. If we figure out how to put this into words that our youngsters can comprehend, I am sure we parents will understand it much better ourselves.

One word of warning. Unless we watch our words in teaching this lesson, we may get to explain "the birds and the bees"—which might not be a bad idea if our kids are old enough and we have failed to discuss such matters with them.
