## TIPS FOR TEACHING PARENTS

When we successfully teach *one* idea in a lesson, our time is well spent. When teaching small children, we are usually wise to limit ourselves to one main point in each study session. Before we sit down to study with our kids, we should know exactly what we want them to grasp from the lesson. In most of these FBS lessons, we pick out one outstanding truth to highlight in the questions and memory verses.

In this lesson, however, the story is so full of important ideas that it is hard to narrow it down. As the title indicates, one strong truth is Christ's acceptance without prejudice of people in all nations. Another idea centers in the "living water" theme; still another is the concept of worship unlimited by geography. Christ's statement, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me," could spark a whole session of teaching. In our daily studies with our families, we may want to build around a different truth each day.
