TIPS FOR TEACHING PARENTS

When we teach the life of Christ, we are teaching on at least two levels: 1) We are teaching the simple details of Christ's life—the places he went, the things he did, the people he met. 2) We are teaching truths to guide our children for the rest of their lives.

Both levels are important; both are necessary for strong Christian lives. Too often, however, we have emphasized the first and almost overlooked the latter. Perhaps we do this because the facts are easier to teach. They require little thought or understanding on our part. But these facts are worth little unless they have a meaningful application in our lives. So, as we teach our children this story, and as we help them learn the names of the apostles, let's be sure also to teach the underlying truth that Christ still needs helpers. He wants us to follow him, too.
