## TIPS FOR TEACHING PARENTS

"I just can't find time to study with my kids," one mother told me. She was no different than the rest of us. Living at our mad pace, few of us find time for the really important things. But let us suggest how to sandwich in some precious moments of storytelling and listening.

If our very small children have a regular nap time or quiet time, we can put them to bed or settle them down with a quick Bible story. They will go to bed more willingly, and the storytelling time will become a thing they look forward to. Dishes will wait for ten minutes. Really. And our floors won't get any dirtier while the story time happens. The little hearts and minds we mold are more important than dishes or floors anyway.

Older youngsters, especially those who walk home from school, can be stopped and held with a story when they burst in from school-before they get absorbed in toys or TV or homework.

These are only suggestions, of course. Each of us must do what works best in his or her home. You must plan your own realistic schedule. But we must plan, or this vital part of our children's lives will be crowded out by less important things.
