TIPS FOR TEACHING PARENTS

Perhaps you will notice that this story is recorded in Matthew before the healing of Peter's mother-in-law. You may wonder why we are studying it afterwards.

As we study the life of Christ we soon discover that Matthew did not write his Gospel in chronological order. He grouped events in Jesus' life by subject or by type of teaching (such as a whole chapter of parables in Matthew 13). The other Gospel writers stick more carefully to the order of events as they happened in our Lord's life. First he went here, then there, and so forth.

How do we know where the events of Matthew come in Jesus' life. It is not always easy to tell. Sometimes, in fact, it is impossible. But by comparing all the Gospels closely, Bible readers have been able to list most of the events in the order they happened. Books called "harmonies" of the Gospels have been written, listing the events of all four Gospels in order. Whenever we study the life of Christ, we can refer to one of these books to find out which event probably came before another.

This is why we appear to be skipping around from one place to another in the Gospels as we study Jesus' life and ministry. We're trying to do it chronologically.
