









The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar were saying, "Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is he." Others said, "No, but he is like him." He kept saying, "I am the man."

So they said to him, "Then how were your eyes opened?" He answered, "The man called Jesus made mud and anointed my eyes and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' So I went and washed and received my sight."

Protecting the Orthodoxy

They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. Now it was a Sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes.

So the Pharisees again asked him how he had received his sight. And he said to them, "He put mud on my eyes, and I washed, and I see."

Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath." But others said, "How can a man who is a sinner do such signs?"

"Rabbi, we **know** that you are a teacher come from God, for **no** one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him."

And there was a **division** among them.

So they said again to the blind man, "What do you say about him, since he has opened your eyes?"
He said, "He is a prophet."

Fear of Losing Fellowship

The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight, until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight and asked them,

"Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?" His parents answered, "We know that this is our son and that he was born blind.


But how he now sees we do not know, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him; he is of age. He will speak for himself.





So for the second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give glory to God. We know that this man is a sinner."

John 9:24-27

He answered, "Whether he is a sinner I do not know. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see."

John 9:24-27

They said to him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" He answered them, "I have told you already, and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you also want to become his disciples?"

John 9:24-27

And they reviled him, saying, "You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where he comes from."

The man answered, "Why, this is an amazing thing! You do not know where he comes from, and yet he opened my eyes.

We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if anyone is a worshiper of God and does his will, God listens to him.

Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a man born blind. If this man were not from God, he could do nothing."

They answered him, "You were born in utter sin, and would you teach us?" And they cast him out.

Worship and the Will

Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?

John 9:35-38

He answered, "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who is speaking to you.

John 9:35-38

He said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him.

John 9:35-38

Jesus said, "For judgment I came into this world, that those who do not see may see, and those who see may become blind."

John 9:39-41

Some of the Pharisees near him heard these things, and said to him, "Are we also blind?"

John 9:39-41

Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no guilt; but now that you say, 'We see,' your guilt remains.

John 9:39-41

Indeed, in their case the prophecy of Isaiah is fulfilled that says:

You will indeed hear but never understand, and you will indeed see but never perceive.

For this people's heart has grown dull, and with their ears they can barely hear, and their eyes they have closed,

lest they should **see** with their eyes and **hear** with their ears and **understand** with their heart and **turn**, and I would heal them.

But blessed are your eyes, for they see, and your ears, for they hear.

Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him,

so that the word spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: Lord, who has believed what he heard from us, and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?

Therefore they could not believe.



Is it...

We won't because we can't?

or

We can't because we won't?

We don't because we won't.

Therefore they could not believe. For again Isaiah said,

He has blinded their eyes and hardened their heart, lest they see with their eyes, and understand with their heart, and turn, and I should heal them.

Isaiah said these things because he saw his glory and spoke of him.
